The very next day Donal brought two guys from Northern Idaho on a 7 mile backpack to Stanley Hot Springs. We started our backpack along the Lochsa River in tee-shirts. It was a beautiful day to be hiking in the mountains. To reduce the impact to the springs, we camped a half mile away on a ridge that overlooks the watershed. Teaching minimum impact camping is one of our goals at Adventure Learning. We had the hot springs to ourselves for the weekend, as no one else braved the elements to be

out there. We got a little bit of weather (snow as we sat in the 104 degree water) but on the whole it was pretty warm. We brought snow shoes but never ended up needing to use them.

Grand Canyon National Park

The Spring break trip to the Grand Canyon ended up being very multicultural. We led three kids (10, 11, & 12), and two post-doctoral students in Hydrology – one from Iran and the other from Germany. We had some incredible weather on our nine day trip. After two days of day hikes along the rim and down the Kaibab trail. Then we were ready for the Hermit trail, our 10 ½ mile backpack down to the river at Granite Rapids – one of the bigger rapids on the Colorado River. We camped there in the dunes, where it was so warm that guide Donal Wilkinson slept on top of his sleeping bag!

It was 96 degrees down at the river and we spent much of one day swimming in the chilly 50 degree water of the Colorado. During our stay we saw deer, elk, big horned sheep, bats, lizards, endangered California condors and many more animals. We were also treated to 22 species of plants in bloom! On our way home we stopped at Glen Canyon Dam to get our second Jr. Ranger Badge of the trip. A fun and challenging time was had by all.
